Regulatory proposals where no RIA is required	<i>The proposal expands the list of persons that can seek the advice of the Integrity Commissioner under section 12 of the Integrity Act 2009 as amended by the Integrity and Other Legislation Amendment Act 2022. The amendments do not increase costs or regulatory burden on business or the community and are unlikely to have adverse impacts. These amendments are not subject to regulatory impact analysis under the Better Regulation Policy.</i>


